SquashLevels will replace the current grading points system with NZ grades (A-J) to be determined by a player's SquashLevels rating, elevating the competitive landscape within the New Zealand squash community and offering the opportunity for New Zealand players to compare themselves against squash players globally while still retaining a NZ grade. This is due to take effect for the 2024 season.
